Saul Meltzer, 91, passed away Thursday October 4, 2018. Saul lived at Menorah House in Boca Raton for the past five years. Prior to that, he was a resident of Las Verdes in Delray Beach where he served as president of the Forsythia section. A proud WW II US Navy veteran, Saul came to Florida in 1990 from Hicksville, NY. Saul was an avid reader, sometimes consuming five books in a week and was very computer literate, using his computer skills to construct a genealogy record of his family. He also was an enthusiastic fan of the NY Times crosswords and possessed an uncanny sweet tooth. In New York, Saul was a long time Boy Scout leader and inspired two of his sons to become Eagle Scouts and one a Life Scout.
