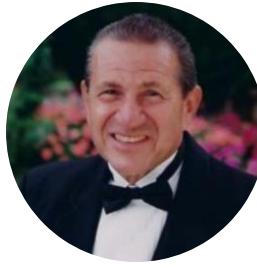

COHEN, Dr. Marshall Y., age 84, of Boca Raton, formerly of Delray Beach and New York, passed away on March 18, 2018.
