Growing up in Dayton, Ohio, Peggy studied at Indiana University and Wright State before earning her Bachelors at Ohio State in Columbus and Masters at Miami's Barry University. Her oldest son, Dr. Alexander Eisenberg, was born in Dayton, Ohio. Her youngest, Michael Eisenberg, was born in Kfar Saba, Israel during several years she lived in the country.
