Les gave his family and friends so many wonderful memories. He will be greatly missed.

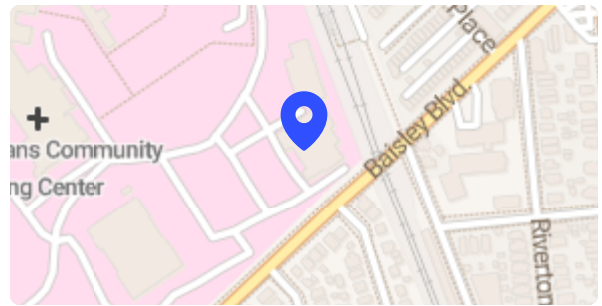
