As I am sure my father will rely on these friends at this time, Elaine and dad could be counted to share the wonderful experiences, and the times of need as they aged. Their many friends are a testament to her caring and devotion. Elaine loved ice skating and for years traveled to various competitions to experience firsthand the beauty of this sport and the competition.
