Barbara’s family was her greatest source of pride and her lasting legacy.

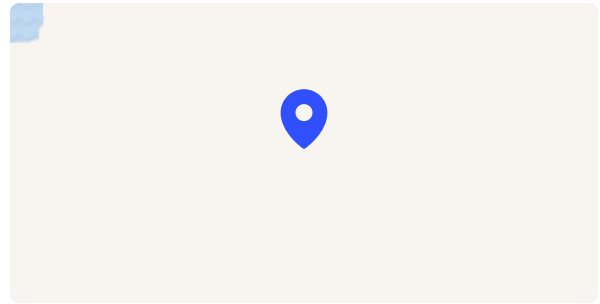
In deference to Covid restrictions, a private burial will be held. A memorial service will be planned in the future.
