An open house will take place on Tuesday, January 21st and Wednesday, January 22nd from 1:00pm-4:00PM



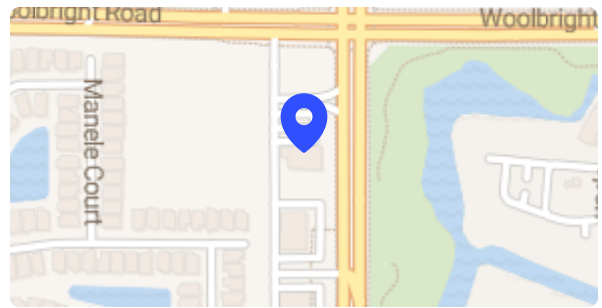
