### **D**r. Barbara (Feldberg) Stern (1929-2026)

STERN, Dr. Barbara Sally Feldberg Stern, age 97, of Palm Beach, Florida, passed away peacefully at home on March 3, 2026.

Born in Boston, Massachusetts to Max and Elizabeth (Ectman) Feldberg on February 15th, 1929, Barbara was often praised for her combination of brains and good looks, and later attended Smith College and Wellesley College, graduating with honors.

The family expresses its sincere appreciation to Dr. Stern's dedicated caregivers of many years.

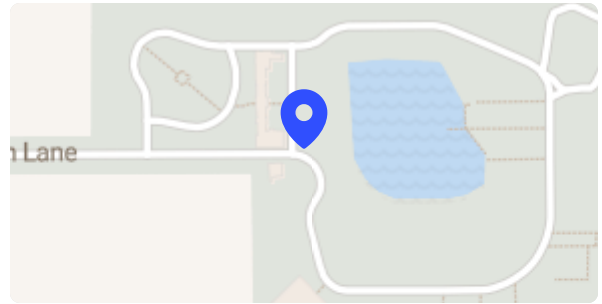
A private burial service will be held at Eternal Light Memorial Gardens in Boynton Beach, Florida.
