



## Walter M Lechten

February 12, 1929 - May 24, 2020

LECHTEN, Walter M. Age 91, of Lake Worth, Fl., and formerly of Newton, Ma., passed on May 24, 2020 after an heroic battle with pancreatic cancer. He was the beloved husband of 65 years

to Charlotte Becker Lechten.

He was born on February 12, 1929 in Boston, Massachusetts to Abraham and Anna Lechten. He

attended Roxbury Memorial High School for Boys and graduated Boston University with several

masters degrees. He spent most of his career teaching Physical Education and coaching at

Devotion School in Brookline, Ma., and was also the principal of Temple Sinaii religious school.

In addition to his loving wife, Walter is survived by his children: Amy Portney and her husband

was lifelong from when he was a child, to his position as a pitcher for the New York Giants farm team, and continued long after his retirement when he played softball. Walter is a veteran of the Korean War. He served honorably in the Air Force for four years.
